

Treetops Welcomes Your Dog

As dog owners who like to treat their dog as part of the family, we want our guests to have the same experience at Treetops..

We welcome well behaved dogs. We do some things to enhance your dog's experience, we ask a few things in return to keep Treetops beautiful.



Couch Covers

If you like to have your dog with you on the couch, they are welcome. Please use the couch covers we provide to protect the furniture if your dog snuggles up with you. Just not on the bed thanks!

Dog Bowls

We provide some dog bowls if you don't bring your own.

Pick-Up Bags

We have spare pick-up bags if you run short. Please ensure Treetops is pristine after your visit so other guests are not impacted. Please clean up any accidents.

Fenced Area

There is a fenced area between our carport and the house. It has a wire fence about 1.1m high, enough to keep non-jumping dogs in. Our side deck is also enclosed, with a handrail 1m high.

Sandy Feet

If your dog has been to the beach, please wash off sand outside. There is a hose beside the deck and we usually provide a towel. Turn tap off after use, a hose blowout would drain the tanks!

Beach Walks With Your Dog

We are 2 minutes by car (10 minutes walking downhill) from the sand at Wye River beach and most of the year your dog can run free on the beach. In summer (Dec 24 – Apr 30) the main beach is closed to dogs 9am – 7pm. We go early in the morning when there are few folks about.

At the west end of the beach (to the right of the toilet block), you can walk your dog all year round.

Dogs love the walk to the rocks, the pools, the seaweed and the smells. You can also walk on the rocks to Separation Ck.



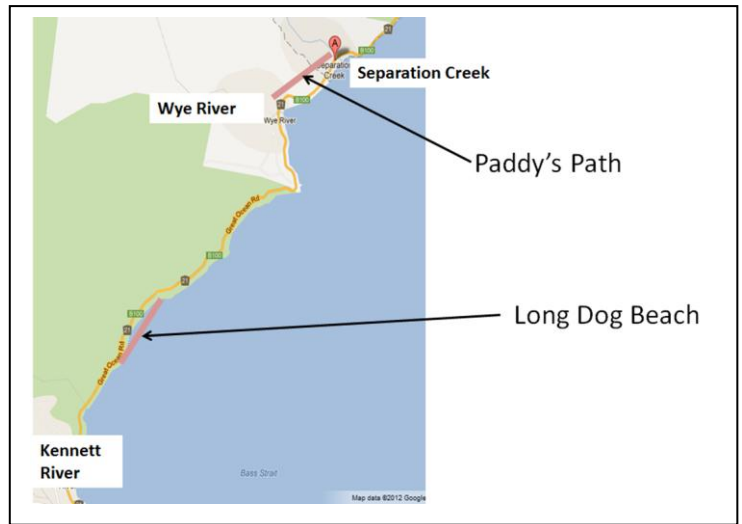
The Long Dog Beach

It is not well known that there is a long empty beach, half way between Wye River and Kennett River, where dogs are permitted all year round. It is often deserted. Our dog loves it!

Paddy's Path

There is a pretty walk between Wye River and Separation Creek on the high side of the road with some interesting views.

It starts at the CFA fire station near the bridge at Wye River. It is not well signed, but persist and you will find it on the sea side of the CFA building.



Village Walks

You can take loop walks in the village in Karingal Dv starting from Treetops. Spot Koalas!

The Koala Rule

We are blessed with Koalas around Wye River. They randomly walk on the roads. Some have been badly mauled by 'nice' dogs who got carried away. Please keep your dog on a leash on walks.

Forest Walks

There are a few forest tracks going up the ridge. One starts at the corner of Karingal and Dunoon. It heads steeply up the ridge for about 10 kms, eventually meeting a ridge road. You can head south early and loop back down to the village. Dogs love to walk and walk....

Wye General Café

The General encourages well behaved dogs outside, with water bowls. Life is good having brunch at The General, with your dog beside you.

The Pub

The pub excludes dogs, following some incidents in the past with badly behaved dogs. We leave our dog in the car in the car park if we visit the pub and the weather is cool.

Wilderness and Snakes

We live in a wilderness. A paradise of Koalas and birds. Like most parts of Victoria, we share the wilderness with snakes. Good supervision will prevent tragedy from snakebite. Letting your dog roam free is very unwise.

Vets

The nearest permanently staffed vets are at Torquay (50 mins away) and Colac (1 hr away).

Torquay - 5261 6486 – Animal House Vet Clinic (After hrs 0418 507 930. They usually stock a snakebite anti-venine for tiger/brown. No need to bring the snake!)

Torquay - 5261 4137 – Torquay Vet hospital

Colac - 5231 3375 - Murray St Vet Clinic (Vet on call 24 hrs).

Colac - 5232 1792 – Colac Vet Clinic
